10. Self- Assessment:

Bringing technology into the classroom enables learners to assess their own work in a more meaningful way. The learner becomes more informed about the quality of his work and accepts feedback more willingly. It gives him a chance to undertake a more self-monitoring role, which thus leads to a higher chance of fulfilling all his tasks successfully. Teachers, on the other hand, can also evaluate learner's knowledge more accurately and with objectivity. The overall evaluation shift from teacher to self and peer evaluation (DEECD 2010) contributes to the development of learner independence which is the main focus of learning in the 21st century.

Limitations of Using Technology:

There are many advantages to language learning with the help of technology. At the same time it would be wrong to expect technology to transform both teacher and learner effortlessly without having some barriers. Here is a look at the limitations of technology in language learning process-

1. Lack of Access to Technology:

Lack of access to technology resources is an obstacle. An internet connection is a major disadvantage for those learners who can hardly afford to gain access to a computer or an internet connection (Coghlan 2004). The initial start-up expenses (Warschauer & Meskill 2000) and the costs of both hardware and computer equipments are also an issue. Non- availability of technology and even low network can create a hindrance as well

as lack of expertise on the part of the teachers.

2. Teachers' Attitude:

Research shows that teachers' attitude towards technology is a barrier. Some teachers think that the use of technology is a disruptive tool and they resist the change (McGrail 2005). Teachers lack confidence because their fear of failure in technological knowledge makes them feel anxious (see Beggs 2000)

3. Students' Attitude:

Researchers have shown concern about the students' reaction on how to use technology in the classroom. If the shift is major and sudden and students feel the experience negatively, there may be resistance to such changes, which in turn will lead to poor performance in academics. Using technology means moving fast. In the bargain, grasping the subject sometimes becomes difficult.

4. Inadequate Time and Technical Support:

Lack of time and technological and technical support (Jacoben & Lock 2005) could be the other reasons for teachers' disinclination toward using technology. Teachers' lack of preparation time with technology and its implementation is another major barrier.

Conclusion:

Thus, this paper has tried to discuss the advantages and limitations of using technology in today's language learning classrooms – thereby maximising its benefits for language teaching and learning.
