The teacher is to throw away prejudices if any and is to treat all students equally, providing them with equal opportunities for learning and is to make them feel confident enough.

2. Creating a conducive Learning Environment:

It demands the role of a competent enough teacher to create a safe and conducive learning environment for the learners. This will pave way for a high performance and behaviour levels among students. The students will also be

encouraged to speak up freely with the teacher in such a classroom atmosphere.

3. Designing a good Lesson Plan:

A skilled teacher will be capable of designing lesson plans in order to meet the needs of the students and also keep up the required standards. It includes with it the choosing and creation of teaching-learning materials according to the students who are at different levels in the same classroom.

4. Ability to implement varied teaching strategies:

This will promote multiple learning styles among students. Hence, the teacher is to participate in professional development workshops and training sessions to update with the new teaching —learning practices and strategies.
